## HOME AND COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES

Goodwill has been providing personalized supports and services for people with developmental disabilities for over 30 years. We offer three service locations on two islands, Hilo, Honolulu, and Kapolei. Services include **Adult Day Health focusing group support, Personal Assistance/Habilitation, and Habilitation Supported Employment provides one-to-one support.**

## PERSON CENTERED PLANNING:

Individuals with the help of family and friends develop an Individual Plan based on their abilities, strengths, needs, and preferences. The plan includes the goals and desired outcomes of the person receiving services. Coaching strategies, counseling, and community inclusion activities help the individual progress toward the desired goals and outcome.

## SERVICE DELIVERY:

Service activities and frequency of services are organized around needs of the individual. Activities help each person move toward the use of natural supports, self advocacy, and self sufficiency. Program settings can vary from classroom to community and provide opportunities to develop and increase social contacts, personal relationships, community networks, new skills and new supports including but not limited to:

## PROGRAM CURRICULUM
